# LEELANAU TOWNSHIP HOUSING FACTS SNAPSHOT 3/16/23

#### HOW MUCH HOUSING DO WE HAVE IN LEELANAU TOWNSHIP?

- **2,035 units**, **56%** of which are vacant.
- Of the occupied units, almost all are owner-occupied (93%). We have almost no rentals.
- Of the vacant units, 941 (83%) are for seasonal, recreational or occasional use.
- Almost all are single family detached homes, and we have no 3-unit or larger housing.
- Somewhere in the total housing inventory, 100 or more are used as short term rentals.

### HOW MUCH HOUSING IS AVAILABLE?

Virtually none. As of March 13, 2023, a Zillow For-Sale search turns up 52 properties in Leelanau County; only one is in Leelanau Township (listed at \$1.3M). A search for rentals shows 1 result (not in the Township).

## HOW MUCH DOES HOUSING COST?

- Costs have been rising steeply especially since 2020. Median cost in 2022 was \$494K.
- Current listings for sale: 2 units for less than \$150K, and nothing else less than \$375K.
- Median price for houses sold so far in 2023 (MLS) is **\$459K**.
- Current median price of all houses listed on MLS is **\$975K**.

### HOW MUCH CAN PEOPLE IN LEELANAU TOWNSHIP AFFORD?

- Less than we are spending right now...
- 30% of gross income is the max affordable housing budget. Using this and the median income, we calculated a median housing budget of \$1,925/month for all housing costs including utilities. (Keep in mind this maximum budget is theoretical, would adjust for number of people in a household, and so on). A median value is right in the middle half of the households have less than the median income, and half have more. In other words, half of Leelanau Township households could not afford \$1925/month.
- Leelanau County Home value to household income ratio is **5.5**. Recommended is 2.6.
- 64% of Leelanau households are at a ratio of 3+.
- 50% of our population falls below the ALICE threshold (asset limited income constrained employed they have jobs but they don't earn enough to afford the cost of living). Housing is one of many things they struggle with. For a family in this circumstance, a *survival* budget allocates \$796 for housing.

## HOW MUCH HOUSING DOES LEELANAU TOWNSHIP NEED?

- Housing North Target Market Analysis (2019) showed county-wide needs of 688 units by 2025. (301 owned, 367 rentals). 50% of the owned units were needed at values less than \$250K, and 83% of the rentals at rents of less than \$1,000.
- If we extrapolate based on population (Leelanau Township is 10.5% of the County population), our best guess is that we need something in the neighborhood of 39 rentals (32 at \$1000 or less) and 32 owner units (16 valued at <\$250K).</li>
